

Terminal Server Setup

Setting up iDraft Pro and CL1 on Terminal Servers

Whilst not an approved method of running iDraft, at your own risk it is possible to install iDraft Pro and CL1 on a terminal server.

You must ensure that the following steps are followed precisely:

DATA EXECUTION PROTECTION (DEP)

Please ensure the following DEP setting applies:

- Go to the Control Panel
- Go into the "System" section
- Click "Advanced System Settings" in the top left of the screen
- In the "Advanced" tab, under the "Performance" header, click "Settings"
- Click the "Data Execution Prevention" tab
- Ensure that "Turn on DEP for essential Windows programs and services only" is selected.

SHARING DATABASES

The potentially shared element of the system comprises a solicitors' database and a preferences section. It isn't necessary that these elements are shared, but they can be.

Sharing these databases hasn't been rigorously tested and sharing them is done at your own risk.

If you want to share them, run the software and then press D when the splash screen comes up. This will allow you to choose a path to store the shared databases. You should choose a location that is permanently accessible. Then run the software on the other servers and this time press P on the splash screen to point to the folder you have just selected to store the databases.

This will then share the databases.

SETTING BACKUP PATH

Run the software and click Tools > Preferences. Check the box for the autobackup and then select a path to store the backups which should be a permanently accessible folder.
